A second portion of this volume contains c.34 manuscript leaves which begins "Statuta apud West(onasterium) edita anno rr Henr(ici) iiii pmo" which translate to "Statutes issued at Westminster in the first year of the reign of King Henry IV". Collation as follows – Leaves 1-48 rubricated, 49-84 are not, 85-89 rubricated, 90-135 are not, 4 blank and then the last 34 are not. Plus, the final leaf with more text below an indistinct heraldic shield.

The handwriting is characterized by its fluid, looped descenders and angular strokes, typical of professional clerks and scribes in the 15th century. It uses standard medieval abbreviations (such as the "p" with a stroke for "per" or "pro") to save space on expensive parchment. The layout, with wide margins for annotations and the dense, justified block of text, is classic for parliamentary rolls or "Statutes of the Realm" collections, which were compiled to distribute new laws throughout the kingdom.'

This hardbound manuscript is from the library of Sir Thomas Phillipps (1792 – 1872). He had amassed a collection of over 60000 books most of which were original manuscripts. This book has the original library numbering 10848 common to many of the books from his library. The library was sold off following a court order granted in 1885. It took sixty years to sell off the entire collection.
